Manage safety the same way you manage your business

I'm not sure when it happened first... I know that I've been guilty of it. I don't know when it will stop, but I know it has to. There are an overwhelming number of companies that make the safety process look entirely different than the process they use to manage their business.

These same companies wouldn't dream of running their businesses using some model developed by an anonymous group of "experts" that was available to them (in some cases) absolutely FREE. If you were to be offered "the secret to successful business – FREE" you would be VERY skeptical of such a plan. Yet in safety management circles we are often asking leadership to change their management processes to fit one or more of the popular "Safety Management Systems". These systems prescribe a list of activities and methods that must be accomplished to "pass" the rigors of this "System". How absolutely ridiculous!

Most corporations can describe in detail how they manage their process of producing the goods or services they provide to their customers. Even in the public service area, we know EXACTLY how we do what we do. Why then would we abandon our known process and adopt a new process that often flies in the face of our regular methods to inflict safety management on our successful businesses.

If there is one thing I could change about my thirty years in the safety business, it would be this... I would make safety management look MORE like our regular processes and less like some standard of safety that I purchased or downloaded from a government website.

My Integrated Safety Management System is exactly opposite to most systems available... it's a performance based standard. The system demands that you make safety practical and fit your culture of doing work. This is a much more successful approach! Go ahead and try it... actually you are already doing it!
