## A Bird's Eye View

Work-related causes claimed the lives of 951 workers in Canada in 2017. The Northwest Territories and Nunavut win the dubious honour of having the highest five-year average injury fatality rate of 7.7 per 100,000 workers. These are the findings of the 2019 Report on Work Fatality and Injury Rates in Canada released by the University of Regina in April.

Sean Tucker, Ph.D., associate professor of human resource management at the University of Regina's faculty of business administration, looked into Saskatchewan's workplace fatality rates in 2012 when the province saw a spike in job-related deaths. "I couldn't find any publication with regard to this," he recalls.

The 2019 report is based on injury and fatality data that provincial and territorial workers' compensation boards (WCBs) submit to the Association of Workers' Compensation Boards of Canada (AWCBC) every year. The report, which provides a jurisdictional comparison of job injury and fatality rates between 2012 and 2017, classifies occupational fatalities in two categories: those caused by job-related injuries; and workers who died from occupational diseases:

- **Injury-related fatalities:** Among provinces with more than 100,000 workers, Saskatchewan, Alberta and Newfoundland and Labrador have the highest five-year average injury fatality rate at 4.9, 3.7 and 3.1 per 100,000 workers respectively. A comparison of the average rate between 2012 to 2014 and 2015 to 2017 reveals that New Brunswick saw the greatest increase in injury fatality rate at 111 per cent, followed by Quebec at five per cent. Saskatchewan showed the greatest decline (-46 per cent), followed by Manitoba (-35 per cent) and Nova Scotia (-27 per cent).

- **Occupational-disease fatalities:** Newfoundland and Labrador had the highest five-year average occupational disease fatality rate of 8.2 deaths per 100,000 workers, followed by Nova Scotia at 4.8 deaths per 100,000.

Unlike injury-related fatality rates, which show a general downward trend, occupational disease fatality rates vary among jurisdictions. A comparison of three-year average rates between 2012 to 2014 and 2015 to 2017 shows that Nova Scotia (18 per cent), Quebec (15 per cent) and Ontario (four per cent) saw the greatest percentage increase in occupational-disease fatality rate. In contrast, Manitoba had the greatest percentage decrease, down 34 per cent, followed by Newfoundland and Labrador (-29 per cent) and Saskatchewan (-10 per cent).

As for injury rates, Manitoba had the highest five-year average injury rate (3 per 100), followed by British Columbia (2.23 per 100) and Saskatchewan (2.19 per 100) among provinces with more than 100,000 workers.

While the report offers a bird's eye view of oh&s injuries and fatalities across the country, "there is a lag between when the fatalities and injuries occur and when the statistics are published on AWCBC website," Dr. Tucker says.

The data from AWCBC are based on when a claim was accepted by a WCB, not when the incident occurred. The latest 2019 report captures data up to 2017. Provincial fatality statistics for 2018 will only be available in early 2020.

Another limitation is underreporting for various reasons: the severity of injuries; claim suppression; the use of alternative insurance policies to cover an injured worker's expenses; and fatalities that occur decades after work exposures. Estimates suggest that underreporting range anywhere between 30 and 40 per cent. "Underreporting of injuries is rampant,"

says Bob Barnetson, Ph.D., professor of labour relations at the faculty of humanities and social sciences in Athabasca University in Athabasca, Alberta.

The lack of harmonization in reporting parameters is another factor, since regulation of workplace safety is not centrally driven, but falls under federal and provincial or territorial jurisdiction. Differences in industry mix and the size of the labour force, coupled with the use of workplace- accommodation practices, further compound the differences in reporting.

Dr. Tucker thinks there is room for improvement in the timeliness and accuracy of cross-jurisdictional oh&s reporting. He suggests that AWCBC extract the most salient data and publish them in the early part of the following year. More detailed statistics, which may be of less interest to the public, can be released later in the year.

Alan Quilley, president and owner of Safety Results Ltd. in Sherwood Park, Alberta, thinks a fresh approach is needed. "Unless we do, you will be able to write this same report in ten years from now."
